These funds will support expanding pre-k programs, removing caps on support for children with disabilities, expanding support for first-year teachers, and adding more teaching assistants for the early grades to decrease literacy deficits. Leandro will provide qualified teachers in every classroom with continuing professional development so they can be effective instructors in their field.

That includes every state and local elected official and adult involved with making our schools and our entire district shine in some of the most challenging times.
