Please use the <u>graduation requirements</u>, <u>check list</u> and <u>transcript</u> to select the courses for next school year. (Note: when making class selections –please do not select basic unless your child has an IEP that supports that choice)

It is very important that parents review and discuss their child's course selections, including electives to ensure they are taking classes to fulfil the necessary requirements for graduation.

Once selections have been made:

- (1) Course selections can be entered directly in Powerschool (student/parent portal)
- (2) The course selection form can be mailed back to Northwest
- (3) The course selection form can be dropped off at Northwest Mon Thurs from 9am to 2pm

Course selection forms need to be returned/information in Powerschool by May 15, 2020





HCS Graduation Requirements

The total of 28 credits are completed with high school courses and dual enrollment college courses. These graduation requirements are considered the Future-Ready Course of Study (FRC) requirements and prepare students for postsecondary success.
